## CAMBRIDGE AICE PROGRAM

- Programs help students to develop deep subject knowledge, conceptual understanding and high order thinking skills. Skills are transferable across subject areas.
- Qualifications are widely recognized by universities around the world.
- Programs are designed to challenge and inspire students of all ability levels.
- Students who successfully complete the AICE courses required to earn the AICE Diploma + complete 100 service or work hours are automatically eligible to receive the full bright futures scholarship, regardless of their scores on the SAT/ACT.


## CURRENT CAMBRIDGE OFFERINGS

To earn a Cambridge AICE Diploma, you must pass seven AICE course exams \& we recommend this is done before your Senior Year (if possible). You may take as many AICE courses as you want however, you must take at least one course and exam each of the 4 groups and the core Global Perspectives course. All courses must be completed in a 3-year span (ideally, 9 th to $11^{\text {th }}$ grade years).

## RISING 9TH COURSE SELECTION OPTIONS-ENGLISH

Students are placed in entry-level core classes based on a variety of available data including:

GPA
Testing
Teacher input
Current coursework performance.
You will be placed in English based on the progression in the next slide.
When entering your Junior year, you will have the option of choosing AP Lit or Honors English if you are on track for graduation. If you have not met concordant scores to be eligible for graduation, you are automatically placed in standard English.


## RISING 9TH COURSE SELECTION OPTIONS-MATH

You will be placed in math based on the progression.
Please note that course requests are completed prior to the release of scores.

Scores may not be available until summer and students will be rescheduled accordingly with the progression based on student data.
For initial requests, counselors will use previous data available including grades in current coursework and available scores.

Placement is based on math course and test scores.
You will be enrolled in biology as a freshman and placed into biology honors or biology standard depending on your FAST score
